Giant Fabric & Quilting Book Sale: September 21, 2010

Clear out your unwanted fabric from your stash - fabrics you liked when purchased them, but that you now know are probably not going to be used. Included in the sale are any quilting books you may want to part with, along with any tools and gadgets. Why not sell them at our September 21st meeting? All monies realized go directly back to you so that you can buy more new fabric to replace what you just sold. And remember -- one quilter's stash-trash is another quilter's treasure. So whether you're bringing fabric to sell or not, *come prepared with cash* for those treasures you're sure to find!

Here are the guidelines:

- You set the price.
- Each piece of fabric, "package" of fabrics, or quilting books must be clearly labeled with:
 - Your name
 - Price you are asking
 - Yardage or size of fabric (not for books or tools)
- Put all this information on a label or tag so when the buyer goes to pay at the cashier table it can be recorded on the "sellers" sheet.
- You may also sell kits, completed tops or orphan blocks. Please no U.F.O's. All items must be labeled like above.
- Pre-register your name with Sally Rapp (610-489-6892) by Saturday, September 20, 2010 if you plan to sell. Since we have to plan the set-up in advance, only names registered will be given table space. All items must fit onto one-half of a large table. Be selective in what you bring to sell because it must fit in the space provided.
- Buyers need to pay in cash, so come prepared.
- Bring your own shopping bag to take home your purchases.



Did You Know?

Sewing machine needles are labeled according to two systems – a U.S. system and a European system. In cases, the smaller the number, the finer the needle. The U.S. sizes range from 8 to 19 while the European sizes range from 60 to 120.

Many needle packages are labeled with a number from each system. For example, 60/8 is a fine needle while a 120/19 is a heavy needle. Generally lightweight fabrics require fine needles and heavy fabrics heavy needles.

Always use a new needle when you start a new project and test your needle on a fabric scrap before sewing your project.

One more thing to note: The order of the numbers doesn't matter. From *Quilters Newsletter*, August/September 2010, page 32.




