COMFORT QUILTS: Maxine Close received 22 quilts this month, bringing the total to 24 for the year. For the Comfort Quilt workshop on March 27, Ruth Heslin, Sandy Dounce, Ann Palmer, and Maxine have kits. Please contact one of them to arrange to pick up a kit. The kits include backing and batting so you can finish the quilt. If you don't wish to do the quilting, return the top with the batting and backing to your contact, and another member may quilt it. Denise at Seamless Sewing Arts in Phoenixville has volunteered to quilt some Comfort Quilts for us.

UFO CHALLENGE: Members shared their finished item for #6 during Show & Tell. Sandy Dounce won the drawing for a surprise. UFO project number for April is 10.

PROGRAM Ruth Heslin introduced Sue Sherman, Quilt Artist, who joined us from Ontario, Canada to share her *Quilting Journey of a Renaissance Woman*. Sue had a career as a mechanical engineer and was always doing crafts, including crochet, tailoring, and lace knitting. She began quilting while she was still working, and a post in Hawaii allowed her to study Hawaiian appliqué on location. She told us: if you are in Honolulu on a Saturday, go quilt at the beginners' table. In addition to fabulous quilts, Sue showed her shell shopping bag. There is a tutorial on her You Tube channel (https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=bYf0AOJ2uuo). She has Facebook/Instagram (sueshermanquilts) and an Etsy store (SueShermanQuilts) with kits and patterns. Sue's current work includes dye painting, quilting, and embellishing portraits of animals she has photographed on her travels. Ann Lister and Cathy Fennell's names were drawn for door prizes that Sue provided.

SHOW AND TELL: Dresden Plate ideas – Judy Snook previously sent an email with some project ideas. For options, try searching the internet for "Dresden plate ideas" (for example: <u>https://www.pinterest.com/jpatton55/dresden-plate-ideas/</u>). A tip is to have the fabrics for roofs, doors, etc. backed with fusible material. An option will be to fuse the houses, too.
