Meeting Minutes February 15, 2022

WELCOME: Deb Graves opened the meeting by welcoming everyone.

ANNOUNCEMENTS: Connie introduced our new member, Carolee Rounsaville, who shared her quilting history.

Deb explained how to "pin" someone on a Zoom meeting thanks to instruction by Erin Wolfgong. **COMFORT QUILTS** Maxine told us that she has been given 52 charity quilts for this year. She set a meet for a lunch date in King of Prussia for March 11^{th.} with a trip to Steve's Sewing afterwards. Check out the upcoming newsletter for details.

WORKSHOPS: The Mystery Quilt Workshop is sold out.

Linda Hamel presented the need for signs saying Do Not Touch for the October Quilt Show. Seven people are signed up so far but she is hoping for more to make at least 30 signs. The workshop is on March 19. The idea is to have fun and go crazy with creativity. No need to fret about designs because she and Judy will have over 35 examples, some templates, and other supplies. She shared what to bring. Times might change for the workshop. Look for more information later.

QUILT SHOW: Deb reminded us that the Quilt Show is October 21-22 and that we want to begin preparing for it. Two categories of needs were presented.

• For the Mini Quilt Raffle, Ruth Heslin showed us some examples of mini quilts for the raffle. She needs 1-2 more people for that committee, 30 members to make mini quilts, and members to sell raffle tickets during the show on Friday and Saturday. The quilts are to be 16×20 inches and include a sleeve. You could use this as an all-in-one quilt for the Challenge, Broderie Perse and a donation.

• Molly Lorenz introduced the Boutique. They need members to consign items they price themselves. The Guild receives 10%. They are looking for new things, not outdated, that people would want to buy perhaps for fall or Christmas. We hope to make items for donations at a future meeting.

BEES: Deb spoke about the new Zoom events added to our meetings and encouraged members to check the newsletter and weekly emails for dates of our Bees and Sew-Alongs. There was good attendance at the new First Tuesday Evening Bee and First Saturday Sew-Along.

PROGRAM: Joan Shaw introduced our guest who is her sister, Liz Dicrescenzo. Liz and fellow guild members, Joyce and Heather, spoke about how their quilt guild made the blocks and created a barn quilt trail for their community in Canada. Their Guild is the Chatham-Kent Quilters Guild. They made a trail of 30 eight foot square quilt blocks along the Thames River. Their Facebook page is Thames River Barn Quilt Trail. They published a book called the *Thames River Quilt Barn Quilt Trail Book.* The trail they made was part of a larger trail along the river. See www.barnquilttrails.ca

ANOTHER SUGGESTION FROM YOUR SEWING MACHINE REPAIR MAN

Often sewing machine repair people don't check your bobbin. Plastic ones can get nicked. Bobbins get scratched. Thread doesn't flow as easily with small imperfections. If this is happening to you, change the bobbin.

Our Quilt Show October 21 - 22, 2022

At our March meeting:

• Carol Olinick will talk about how you can help with Grandma's Attic.

• Rita Mack will let you know about our Unnamed Auction (previously called Chinese Auction). All members can be involved to help make our quilt show successful.

• Mini Quilts Raffle - We are asking members to consider making a mini quilt to donate this September for our show in October. Raffle tickets will be sold at a special display of these quilts. From recent personal experience (buying lots of tickets!) and talking with members from other guilds, this is a very successful fund raiser.

Requirements for mini quilts are 16"-18" width and 20"-24" length.

Include a sleeve, a label is optional.

There is no specific theme. Quilts must be finished, quilted, and bound. It can be pieced, appliquéd, modern or traditional. No cheater cloth. These requirements will be repeated in the June newsletter. Quilts must be donated by our September meeting so a photograph can be taken to attach to the front of each numbered small gift bag holding tickets. There will be a sign-up sheet at our June meeting so we have an idea of how many mini quilts to expect.
