





## **Book Review**

**Unconventional & Unexpected: American Quilts Below the Radar 1950-2000, 2<sup>nd</sup> ed.**

**Roderick Kiracofe**

**Schiffer Publishing 2022**

A few months ago, I ordered this book through *Quiltfolk* magazine. I enjoy looking at and reading about quilts of all types so when I got an offer to get it, I jumped on it. This book is probably not for you if you wonder why anybody cares about the Gees Bend quilts. Many of the quilts pictured are similar with a haphazard appearance--No traditional, precisely pieced designs here. This is a coffee table type book with many pictures of quilts from Kiracofe's extensive collection. It is a series of essays illustrated by the quilt pictures. The writers are designers, curators, teachers, scholars and authors.

One of the essays gives a way of looking at and studying quilts of unknown origin. She has seven characteristics to evaluate: Color, Pattern, Unusual fabric or other material, Humor, Surprise, Unique vision and Intangibles. She defines intangibles by saying, "I don't know—it just speaks to me." I think these give a good way to look at any quilt even if you already know something about it.

One of the other essayists deals with the importance of the story of the quilt. The author is a museum curator and the quilts he loves best are the ones that have a full history. He wants to know the who, what, when, where and why of the quilts in his keeping. The message I got was how important it is to label our work. He also looks at the myth and facts about scrap quilts. While some quilt makers undoubtedly made scrap quilts due to the need for frugality many were (and are today) able to buy small pieces of fabric to make them. He says, "scrap quilts are often more virtue than necessity." For his personal evaluation and viewing of quilts he is mainly interested if whether a quilt appeals to his personal aesthetic. He suggests we look for no other validation than it is beautiful to us as the viewer.

If you find these points interesting, I recommend you look for this book. I found it gave me a way to look at or study quilts that don't initially appeal to me and hopefully I can gain a greater appreciation of them.


## **Comfort Quilts**

## Comfort Quilt Workshop Recipe

August 2022

### **Laura Chaplar's Ham and Cheese Biscuits**

1  $\frac{3}{4}$  c. flour  
2  $\frac{1}{2}$  t. baking powder  
1 t. ground mustard  
 $\frac{1}{2}$  c. ground cumin  
2 eggs  
1 c. buttermilk  
2 c. diced fully cooked ham (Laura put her ham through her food processor to make pieces small)  
2 c. (8 oz.) shredded cheddar, divided

In a large bowl, combine flour, baking powder, mustard, and cumin. In another bowl, beat eggs and buttermilk. Stir into dry ingredients until just moistened. Fold in ham and 1  $\frac{1}{4}$  c. cheese. Fill greased muffin cups  $\frac{2}{3}$  full. Sprinkle with remaining cheese. Bake at 375\* for 20-25 minutes or until toothpick comes out clean. Cool for 5 minutes before removing from pan to wire rack. Serve warm. Refrigerate leftovers. Makes 1  $\frac{1}{2}$  dozen.


