- ✓ Post flyers and notify friends.


Looks like I'm going to be busy. I hope you have the same list and will check it twice!

Minutes from July 16, 2024 Meeting

Welcome: Linda Mitchell welcomed all members in person including one guest, Charlene Hagerty's granddaughter, Victoria Hagerty.

Announcements: Membership renewal dues for 2024/2025 are due. Please see Karen Glasthal. Quilt Show flyers are available for distribution. Kathie Haney, treasurer, gave the treasurer's report.

Membership: one new member, Emily Graff.

Comfort Quilts: Maxine Close mentioned that there were 24 comfort quilts collected in June, for a total of 131 so far this year. There is an in-person Comfort Quilt workshop on Saturday, July 20, 2024. Linda Juzbasich won the comfort quilt drawing.

Workshops: July 20, 2024: In-person Comfort Quilts and Dignity Bib workshop. Lunch will be provided. August 24, 2024: SAM (Stash-buster AccuQuilt Mystery) Workshop with Beth Mancini. The studio will be set up at guild meetings and at workshops for members to cut their fabrics in advance of the SAM workshop. September 28, 2024, Friendship Tea, from 9:30 a.m.-3:00 p.m. The theme will be "Autumn."

50/50 Drawing: no drawing this month.

Door prizes: Ethel Hutchinson, Elsa Scherphorn and Linda Newpher won the door prizes this month.

Program: This month the members enjoyed the annual picnic. Following the picnic, felt craft kits were distributed. Members will complete the felt ornaments and mug rugs, which will be sold in the 2024 Quilt Show Boutique.

Quilt Show Updates: Deb Graves provided updates for the Quilt Show, which will include vendors, Miniquilt Raffle, Gift Basket Raffle, Grandma's Attic, the Boutique, demonstrations, quilt appraisals, the Sweet Shop, and a Comfort Quilt exhibit. Setup will begin at 1:00 p.m. on Thursday, October 17, and quilt pickup will be at 5:00 p.m. on Saturday, October 19. Members must pay their 2025 dues in order to participate in the Quilt Show. A signup genius will be sent out in September requesting members to volunteer to work at the various stations during the Quilt Show. Quilts can have hanging sleeves or be sleeveless, but they do require a quilt label. Members may only enter one quilt measuring 70 inches or longer on one side, two smaller quilts, and two challenge quilts from 2023 and 2024. You may submit three small quilts if you are not entering a large quilt greater than 70 inches.

- -Ruth Heslin provided information about the Mini-quilt raffle. Quilts should measure roughly 16" by 20" and are due by the Friendship Tea in September. The mini-quilts must have a hanging sleeve, and a label is optional.
- -Carol Olinick provided information about Grandma's Attic, and demonstrated how to properly fold, label, and package fabric that will be sold. Grandma's Attic is accepting donations of fabric, notions, rulers, and patterns. Members may bring in items starting at the August Guild meeting. Please donate in boxes, not bags. All sales benefit the Guild.
- -There will be a member's book sale at the September Guild meeting. Please wait until that meeting to bring in your books.

UFO Challenge: The UFO number for July was #1. There were 5 members who presented their completed quilts. Ruth Heslin won the UFO drawing. For the August meeting, please complete #4.

Show and Tell: show and tell followed.

August meeting: The speaker at the August meeting will be Barbara Persing, who will speak about Pictorial Art Quilts. The meeting will be in-person and on Zoom.

The meeting was adjourned.

THE BOUTIQUE

For new members, the boutique is a room at the Quilt Show where members can sell their handmade items. Members receive the proceeds from the sale of their items, less a small % that goes to the Guild. The boutique staff will handle the display and sale of the items. All members need to do is to label their items with price tags (discussed below) and submit the items with the appropriate forms to the boutique staff at the meeting prior to the Quilt Show.

We will have the forms at the August and September meeting for anyone who wants to submit handmade items to the boutique. The forms will also be available online for you to fill out and print. The forms should include an itemized list of all your items. The form should match the tags on the items exactly. Each item must have its own individual price tag, which should include your initials, an item number, and the price. Ex: JF-1 \$20

All items must be picked up on Saturday evening following the show, starting at 5:00 p.m. At drop-off, we will assign you a 10–15-minute timeslot for pickup to help the pick-up process run smoothly after the show. At pick-up, you will review the form with the boutique staff and inventory any unsold items. You will need to sign the form when you pick up your items indicating that you received all unsold items. The form will remain with the boutique until the sales are all reconciled. You will receive a check after the show for your sales, less the % that goes to the Guild.

We are looking for volunteers to help in the boutique and to help keep an eye out for sticky fingers.

Spotlight on a Quilt Shop - Hayes Sewing Machine Company

Trevor and Mary Hayes have sold and repaired sewing machines for over 55 years and now work alongside their three daughters, Stephanie, Loretta and Pamela. This family-run business, Hayes Sewing Machine Co, is located at 4425 Concord Pike, Wilmington, Delaware. The phone number to reach the store is 302-764-9033. They can also be found online at www.trevhayes.com. On the webpage you will find a link to their new app for online sales. They also have a presence on YouTube, Instagram and Facebook. Check them out on YouTube.

All the Hayes folks can answer questions from basic things like machine threading to more complicated things like software. Trevor and Mary were inducted into the Sewing Hall of Fame which recognizes individuals who have had a lasting impact on the sewing industry and have received numerous other accolades and awards.

Hayes has over 40 different new machines if you are in the market for a new one. They also have a good selection of refurbished ones. One side of the store is filled with machines, sewing furniture, notions and patterns, and the other side has over 2500 quilting cottons. There is much to choose from if you are in the market for something new. Many classes from basic sewing, quilting, embroidery and serger classes to software instruction are available.

Machine brands available are Bernina, Babylock, and Handiquilter. They also have on site repair services with four technicians available to work on your machine. They can repair today's machines from most manufacturers as well as your vintage ones. An extensive array of machine accessories is also on hand.

Right now, they are participating in the Mid Atlantic Shop Hop so if you are doing the hop be sure to add them to your plans.


